

Position Title: Vision & Call Project Management Intern

About Us

At JVC Northwest, we co-create our movement for social and ecological justice by building relationships, placing and supporting Jesuit Volunteers, and sharing our stories to support our mission. We respond to local community needs in the Northwest by recruiting, placing, and supporting volunteers who provide value-centered service grounded in the Jesuit Catholic tradition. Volunteers are led by the communities and individuals with whom they serve

We are guided by our core values: spirituality, community, simple living, and social & ecological justice. Our team is committed to living out these values in lives in a variety of ways.

Position Overview

As the Vision & Call Project Management Intern, you'll have the opportunity to work with our staff to connect with our larger community and shape our narrative. The Project Management intern will work alongside staff to develop & execute fundraising strategies, create materials, and design a project throughout the internship using SMARTIE goals as a guide. This experience will be apprenticeship style, at 30 hours per week on average, with some events (in-person and virtual) throughout the year. The type of project and content will be matched to the intern's skills, gifts, and experience.

There will be time built into the internship to reflect on vocational discernment. An important part of this internship is not only what you bring, but how JVC Northwest can guide interns to intentionally think about their passions, enjoyments, and talents and how those can be combined into a vocation.

Interns will receive a stipend of \$1,750 per month (plus a housing stipend) for the tenmonth internship.

What We Are Looking For

We are seeking someone passionate about the JVC Northwest mission who is relational and enthusiastic about engaging and inspiring others.

Good candidates will excel in communication and basic project management skills like problem solving, organization, time management, teamwork, and relationship-building. Since this is a remote position, the intern should be comfortable and open to learning to work and collaborate remotely. They should have experience or an interest in independent work as well. You don't have to be an expert—this role is all about honing your abilities and growing your project management abilities!

What You Can Expect

 - Weekly Vision & Call discussion with interns and mentors and occasional guest
 - Weekly development meetings
- Monthly:
 - One monthly grounding and two all staff meetings
 - o Relevant team meetings once or twice a month
- Annually:
 - Orientation in August
 - Vision & Call Retreat in October
 - Staff Days in December
 - Annual Benefit Event in Seattle
